Congratulations to Sergio Alvarez Moya and Carlo 273 on being named to the Spanish Show Jumping Team that will compete at the **2016 Olympic Games** in Rio de Janiero, Brazil. Sergio, who rides many horses for Gustavo and Carolina Mirabal's G&C Farm. has had a fantastic summer already. Top results include a win at **Knokke Hippique** in Belgium with young horse G&C Durania. Sergio then went on to win back-to-back Youngster Cup classes with Unicstar de l'Aumone at CHIO Aachen in Germany, concluding his incredible week with a third place finish in the €1 Million Rolex Grand Prix of Aachen riding Carlo 273, his mount for the 2016 Rio Olympics. This marks the first time that the Spanish Team will compete at the Olympic Games in 16 years, having qualified through its team sixth place finish at the 2015 European Championships.
