Savannah College of Art and Design (SCAD) hosted the 2017 ANRC National Intercollegiate Equitation Championship in April. This is the second time that SCAD hosted the event at the university's Ronald C. Waranch Equestrian Center, a 100-acre facility that includes 13 turnout pastures, 3 large outdoor arenas, an indoor arena-ideal for competing and practicing in all weather conditions—and a derby course. The grounds feature two state-of-the-art barns for the university's and student riders' horses, and has been recognized by the American Institute of Architects (AIA) Savannah with the 2015 Excellence Award. Widely thought of as one of the most stunning equestrian centers in the collegiate sport, it has been deemed "a



masterpiece in its own right" by Garden & Gun magazine. The SCAD Bees solidified its position as a top equitation team at the event, winning the National Team Division for the 10th time in 13 years, including three out of the last four years. SCAD also won the Novice Team Division for the third consecutive year. This marks the second time that SCAD has achieved the historic feat of winning both the National and Novice Team Divisions at the event. Several SCAD riders took home individual honors as well, with Meredith **Denny** named National Division High Point Rider, Tatum Tatreau (who is Cacchione Cup qualified) named Reserve National Division High Point Rider, and Hannah Hlopak named Novice Division High Point Rider.

Summer Festival has developed a reputation as an exhibitor-favorite for riders from the eastern and Midwestern states of the U.S., as well as Canada. "From weekly exhibitor parties to taking pride in the appearance of our grounds, we do our best to be a show that exhibitors look forward to returning to each year," said Ruth Lacey, marketing director of the Vermont Summer Festival. "As a result, our weeks sell out and the events are very competitive. We really enjoy hosting riders, their horses, and even their families, and we also encourage our visitors to experience what southern Vermont has to offer by way of shopping, dining, and outdoor activities."
