

"The Mustang," directed by Laure de Clermont-Tonnerre and opening in theaters March 15, is about Roman (Matthias Schoenaerts), a convict in a rural Nevada prison who struggles to escape his violent past and is required to participate in an "outdoor maintenance" program as part of his statemandated social rehabilitation. Spotted by a no-nonsense veteran trainer (Bruce Dern) and helped by an outgoing fellow inmate and trick rider (Jason Mitchell), Roman is accepted into the selective wild horse training section of the program, where he finds his own humanity in gentling an especially unbreakable mustang.

Photo by Kathy Russell The CSIO5* Longines FEI Jumping Nations Cup[™] of the United States of America at the 2019 Palm Beach Masters Series lived up to its promise as one of the top events of the year as the historic team challenge made a glorious return to Wellington. A thrilling win by Mexico set off a celebration that will long be remembered for its spirit and jubilation! Held at the spectacular Deeridge Farms, where it will remain at least through 2021, the Nations Cup showcased 60 Olympic-caliber athletes from 13 countries competing with 115 horses for \$716,500 in prize money. Competition drew a packed crowd that filled both parking lots at Deeridge Farms and kept everyone on the edge of their seats right to the end. It came down to the last rider to determine who would finish with the lowest tworound fault total and it was the young team from Mexico who pulled it off for the win. Mexico finished with four faults, while the team from Israel took second place with nine faults, and the United States finished third with twelve.

The New York Empire named their line-up for the 2019 Global Champions League (GCL) with a number of new additions to the team. Team owner Georgina Bloomberg will compete for the New York Empire along with British Olympic team gold medalist Scott Brash, German rider Hans-Dieter Dreher, Israel's Daniel Bluman, Irish rider Denis Lynch and Spencer Smith of the U.S. as the Under 25 team member. In addition, two new sponsors are joining the New York Empire: Sapinda, a privately-owned principal investment holding company, and South Beach Brewing Company, an innovative brewpub in Miami. They join Sam Edelman and The Rider's Closet as New York Empire sponsors. "I'm so grateful for the support of our sponsors," Georgina said.

The GCL's first event took place in Doha, Qatar, on February 28-March 2, and continues in Mexico City, Mexico, on April 11-13 and Miami, Florida, on April 18-20. The series runs through December with shows at venues around the world such as Paris, Rome, London, Doha, Madrid, Shanghai and more. The Montreal, Canada, and New York, New York, stops join the GCL schedule for the first time in 2019, making it 20 weeks of competition on the GCL and Longines Global Champions Tour (LGCT). The New York event will be the finale of the GCL and LGCT regular season and takes place on September 27-29 on Governor's Island in New York City's harbor.
