Celebrating 30 Years and More Than 2,300 Horses Saved!

Thirty years ago, Kathleen Howe first noticed Toby, the neglected buckskin gelding that would ultimately change her life and lead to the saving of more than 2,300 neglected and abused horses.

Toby was the first horse taken in by what is today Days End Farm Horse Rescue (DEFHR), our internationally known non-profit humane organization, based in Woodbine, MD, which is now celebrating three decades of devotion to the care of horses!

We also believe that horses can play a valuable role in educating children, which is why we offer a number of youth programs that we're shining the spotlight on this month!

HOMESCHOOL EDUCATION SERIES



Allow your child the opportunity to learn all about horses through our Homeschool Education Program! This program was designed exclusively for homeschool students and allows participants the opportunity to learn about equines by working hands-on with our horses. Topics are different each month, but in each session, students participate in classroom instruction followed by hands-on activity to reinforce the lesson, with possible topics including grooming, leading, hoof care, the digestive system, dentistry, psychology, and more!

LEGACY PROGRAMS



Our Junior and Youth Legacy programs are a great way to jump start your child's volunteer experience at DEFHR!

Participants spend five to six hours each day learning about a variety of topics relating to horse care and handling, delivered through classroom instruction and reinforced through hands-on learning activities. Participants will also be given the opportunity to participate in one riding activity during each session.

Our Legacy Varsity program is for volunteers ages 14-17 who have a love for equines and want to continue to advance their equine knowledge through volunteer service that includes hands-on experiences and professional supervision. Volunteers in this program have volunteered for more than 80 hours at DEFHR previously either through our standard volunteer program or Youth Legacy program.

SCOUT DAYS



Our two-hour program designed specifically for Scouts includes a tour of the farm, horse tales—stories about how the horses came here—horse care (hoof, dental, nutrition), hands-on horse grooming, hands-on horse leading; and a short riding demonstration.

Participants will earn a Days End Farm Horse Rescue Badge. Additionally, this program meets some of the requirements for each of the following badges:

Girl Scouts: Junior Animal Habitats Badge, Senior Voice for Animals Badge, Make Your Own Badge (any level)

Boy Scouts: Horsemanship Badge, Animal Science Badge, Citizenship in the Community Badge
