AGRICULTURAL WINTER FAIR

f there were such a thing as a universal horse show bucket list, the Royal Horse Show, held as part of the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, would be at the top. A 93-year legacy has established the Royal Horse Show, which takes place each November in Toronto, Canada, as one of the premier indoor horse shows in North America, drawing fans from around the world. The Royal, however, is much more than just a horse show.

In 2016, The Royal returns to downtown Toronto from November 4th through 13th with ten days of top show jumping, dressage, indoor eventing, and a full schedule of events to keep any Fair-goer busy.

The Royal Horse Show offers the serious show jumping

competitor an opportunity to gain valuable world ranking points in the \$132,000 Longines FEI World Cup™ Jumping Toronto. One of only four Longines FEI World Cup™ Jumping events to be held on Canadian soil, the competition is a qualifying event for the 2017 Longines FEI World Cup™ Jumping Final in Omaha, Nebraska.

McLain Ward, who has impressively won the grand prix the last three years in a row, has been attending The Royal since he was a child. His father was a regular competitor, and Ward fondly recalls cheering his dad on from the perimeter of the Ricoh Coliseum. While Ward has won the Royal Horse Show grand prix a total of seven times, what he cherishes most about the event is the atmosphere.

"I love The Royal," said Ward, who continued the family tradition by bringing his nine-month-old daughter, Lilly, to The Royal. "It is a first-class, traditional event held in a beautiful city. Seeing a packed house dressed in black tie is special. It means a lot for me to now have my daughter come here and be a part of it."

Ward won the \$132,000 Longines FEI World Cup™ Jumping Toronto last November aboard HH Azur, the horse that would carry him to the 2016 Rio Olympic Games. Underscoring the international appeal of the Royal Horse Show, Dermott Lennon of Ireland placed second while Colombia's Roberto Teran took third.

Aside from international-caliber competition that draws riders from around the world, the Royal Horse Show also knows that spectators want to have fun. The \$20,000 Horseware Indoor Eventing Challenge, which brings the exhilaration of jumping natural cross-country obstacles as well as traditional show jumping fences into an indoor setting, encourages fans to vocalize their support for the competitors.

In 2015, newly-minted Pan American Games bronze medalist Waylon Roberts excelled in front of an eager crowd to win his record eighth \$20,000 Horseware Indoor Eventing Challenge riding West River.

"It takes a handy horse," said Roberts of the technical and innovative Indoor Eventing Challenge. "One that's going to be really obedient for the tight turns and have the quick speed."

Another fan-favorite, the \$15,000 Canine-Equine Challenge,

matches up teams of horse-and-rider combinations with professional agility dogs. Each rider navigates a show jumping track before their canine partner tackles an agility course in front of an erupting crowd, with the fastest time winning.

Adding to the multi-disciplinary repertoire of the Royal Horse Show is the \$20,000 Royal Invitational Dressage Cup. In 2015, the line-up was not lacking talent with Pan American Games team silver medalists Belinda Trussell and her mount, Anton, bringing home the win.

The Royal Horse Show also stirs up national pride among the Canadian riders who attend. The \$100,000 Greenhawk Canadian Show Jumping Championships sees the top-ranked Canadians going head-to-head over two days, with the winner being crowned the Canadian Show Jumping Champion. In 2015, Olympic team silver medalist Jill Henselwood riding

Farfelu du Printemps unseated ten-time Canadian Show Jumping Champion Ian Millar who was attempting to defend his title.

In addition to show jumping, riders at The Royal share the spotlight with a host of other breed and performance events. From draft hitches to pleasure driving and breed classes, the event covers all the equine bases.

When taking a break from the action, the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair offers unlimited choices for both the shopaholic and the sweet tooth in every show jumping fan. From a sea of shopping opportunities to rows and rows of vendors wielding an endless array of tasty treats, The Royal is a traditional country fair that has been taken to a whole new level.

True to its agricultural roots, The Royal boasts over 2,000 agricultural competitions featuring more than 5,000 animals, vegetables, Ontario wines, the ever-popular butter sculptures, and much more. However, unlike the traditional county fair one might envision, The Royal also offers six restaurants and bars within the fair itself, endless competitions from livestock to fine wines, and even a cooking stage for culinary enthusiasts.

It is not uncommon to see ball gowns and tuxedos mingling

with jeans and cowboy boots in the Royal Horse Show audience. The Royal has seamlessly blended a traditional country fair with the class and style of show jumping, making it a shopping spree, vacation, and classic horse show all built into ten exciting days.
