Fresh off their Olympic debut this summer in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Megan and her mount Caravella made their inaugural Royal Horse Show appearance a winning one with a score of 76.75% in the Grand Prix Freestyle, having also won the previous day's Grand Prix. Reigning Olympic Champion Michael Jung of Germany claimed victory in the innovative \$20,000 Horseware Indoor Eventing Challenge at the Royal Horse Show, held as part of the 94th Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto, Ontario. Michael, who won individual gold and team silver medals at the 2016 Rio Olympics, thrilled a packed house of more than 6,000 fans by guiding Cruising Guy home in the fastest time to win the \$20,000 Horseware Indoor Eventing Challenge. Michael's winning performance in his Royal Horse Show debut was especially remarkable considering he had only ridden his winning mount, owned by **Shawn Ferguson**, for the first time 24 hours earlier. When Michael was unable to bring his own mount as planned, he was sent video of three horses to choose from. Only a two-time Olympic gold medalist like Michael could pick a winner based off a video!

Three-time Olympic medalist McLain Ward of Brewster, New York, claimed an astonishing fourth consecutive win in the \$130,270 Longines FEI World Cup™ Jumping Toronto at the CSI₄\*-W Royal Horse Show, held as part of the 94th Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto, Ontario. McLain and HH Azur, his Olympic team silver medal partner in Rio, successfully defended their 2015 title by posting the only double clear performance of the night over the tracks set by course designer Bernardo Cabral of Portugal to hold off Olympic teammate Kent Farrington, who had the fastest jump-off time

but at the expense of a rail riding **Creedance**. "This venue has been very good to me, so it's like coming home," said McLain, 41, who is aiming for the 2017 **Longines FEI World Cup™ Jumping Final** in Omaha, Nebraska. "When you have a horse like Azur, it makes life a lot easier and you just try to stay out of her way. She is normally giving a great performance, and every once in a while, I don't mess it up."
