Congratulations to Richie Moloney on his fantastic week at the Hampton Classic. Richie won the Longines Rider Challenge as the Classic's leading open jumper rider for the third time in four years and rode Carrabis Z to an exciting win in the \$300,000 Hampton Classic Grand Prix, presented by Longines. The jumpoff in the Grand Prix was one for the ages with Charlie Jacobs placing second on Cassinja S, Andrew Welles taking third on Brindis Bogibo, Beezie Madden finishing fourth on Quister, and defending champion Karen Polle finishing fifth on With Wings. The Classic's new Jump for Charity initiative raised over \$16,000 for a local charity, Caring Hearts for Canines.
