The world-renowned Royal Horse Show will return to downtown Toronto, Canada, as part of the 95th Royal Agricultural Winter Fair from November 3 through 12, 2017. The \$100,000 Canadian Show Jumping Championship kicks of the Royal Horse Show with top-ranked Canadian riders, including 12-time winner and defending champion Ian Millar, going head-to-head over two days on November 3 and 4. International competitors take the stage later in the week, competing in the \$130,000 Longines FEI World Cup Jumping Toronto on Wednesday evening, November 8. One of only four Longines FEI World Cup Jumping events to be held on Canadian soil, the competition acts as a qualifying event for the 2018 Longines FEI World Cup Jumping Final in Paris, France.

Condor C, owned and ridden by Debbie Stephens (USA), was named the Equis Boutique 'Best Presented Horse' Award recipient during the CSI4\* Tryon Summer II horse show held June 7-II, 2017, at Tryon International Equestrian Center (TIEC) in Mill Spring, North Carolina. The FEI Ground Jury chose Condor C, a 12-year-old grey Holsteiner stallion (Cassini I x Caretino), as the Equis Boutique Best Presented Horse, recognizing groom Victor Castillo for his work in preparing Condor C for the FEI Horse Inspection. Victor has worked with Debbie since the 2016 winter season and is a past winner of the Equis Boutique 'Best Presented Horse' Award, having also won the honor with Condor C during the third week of competition at the 2017 Winter Equestrian Festival in Wellington, Florida. "If I had to describe Victor and how he works with the horses in one word, it would be 'meticulous'," said Debbie, who owns and operates Centennial Farm in Palmetto, Florida, "He is very conscientious of every detail, from making sure the horses wear their magnetic blankets to icing and hand-walking them."

Caitlyn and Cassius, an eight-year-old gelding owned by Don Stewart, added numerous ribbons to the Canterbury Farm banner at the Kentucky Horse Park, claiming back-to-back reserve championships in the High Performance Hunters during both Country Heir I and II. As they gear up for the **USHJA International** Hunter Derby Championship in August, the duo also finished in the top ten of the \$30,000 USHJA International Hunter Derby events held each week. In the jumper ring, Canterbury Farm was well represented by Caitlyn and her ten-year-old Warmblood gelding Cavalier II and by Canterbury Farm riders including Madeline Pogorzelski, Marisa Malevitis, and Michelle Durpetti. Madeline and her mount, Davinchie, were named champions of the Intermediate Children's/Adult Jumpers during Country Heir I, while Marisa and **Testimony** also claimed top five ribbons in the division, including a fourth place finish in the \$1,000 Intermediate Children's/Adult Jumper Classic.
