Helmer secured his USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal Finals-East victory after three phases of competition and a challenging work-off.

Judges Linda Andrisani and Chance Arakelian presided over the class, which attracted 39 entries over two days of competition. Following

the Flat, Gymnastics, and Jumping phases, Helmer and Rachael Davis were fewer than five points apart. Therefore, they were required to work off over a second, shortened course with a tight time allowed, designed by Kenny Krome. Davis went first and accrued five time faults, scoring a 79, and providing Helmer with the opportunity to consider his strategy. In the end,

an 80 and clinched the title without time faults. "The work-off was really fun. It tested your ability to ride at a quick pace but still required you to think and execute really well. I thought my work-off was decent. I wasn't overly pleased, but I


