SCAD equestrian team

The Savannah College of Art and Design (SCAD) equestrian team won reserve champion honors at the Intercollegiate Horse Show Association (IHSA) Collegiate Cup Hunter Seat Team National Championship at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, May 3-6. The Bees' runner-up performance follows three previous consecutive IHSA Collegiate Cup National Championship titles for SCAD. SCAD scored a total of 28 points in this year's championship, finishing just behind Skidmore College (30 points). With participation in the National Tournament of Champions Series, American National Riding Commission and the Intercollegiate Horse Shows Association, SCAD Equestrian has secured 15 national team championships and three reserve national team championships (out of a possible 20) over the last five competition seasons.

Young professional **Caitlyn Shiels** and her students at **True North Stables** made quite a mark at the **Maffitt Lake Spring Gathering** I and II (Iowa) on May 9-20. Caitlyn and her

own Cavalier II topped the Open Welcome Stake both weeks and the \$25,000 Maffitt Lake Grand Prix during Week 1, then placed sixth in the \$25,000 Jump To The Rescue Grand Prix. Caitlyn also won the \$2,500 USHJA National Hunter Derby during Week I on Michelle Durpetti's Cassius and placed fifth in the same class during Week 2, while Michelle rode Cassius to the amateurowner hunter reserve championship in Week I and the same title in Week 2 on Lucca. With Caitlyn riding, Elise Ledsinger's Cakewalk took third and second in the \$2,500 USHJA National Hunter Derbies. Caitlyn runs her training and sales business of True North Stables out of its summer base at Buena Vista Farm in Zion, Illinois.
