McLain Ward (USA) claimed the ninth Royal Horse Show World Cup title of his career when he and the 10-year-old mare **HH Gigi's Girl** scored victory in the \$205,000 Longines FEI Jumping World Cup in its new Saturday night time slot to close out the Royal Horse Show. The two-time Olympic team gold medalist topped a 21-horse field over tracks set by 2018 WEG course designer Alan Wade of Ireland. "This was a gymnastics test, which is what courses are now at the highest level," said Ward, 43, who also earned Leading International Rider honours. "I think of this as a second home. As you saw, we had a sold-out crowd, and I'm thrilled to be part of it."



Israel's **Daniel Bluman**, 28, won the \$85,000 GroupBy "Big Ben" Challenge riding **Ladriano Z**, a 10-year-old Zangersheide gelding – the last and fastest in the exciting 11-horse jumpoff. "I won by a fraction of a second – I got lucky," he admitted, adding, "We go to a lot of competitions, but when you're at a show like this, every class you compete in, you want to perform. Forget about the prize money, forget about the world ranking points, forget about anything else; you just want to be the best that you can be for the crowd. That's what makes it fun!"

McLain Ward also raced to victory riding Tradition de la Roque in the \$50,000 Weston Canadian Open, just edging Canada's Keean White and Leilani. "The environment here is brilliant," enthused Ward. "This is a crowd that really understands the sport and appreciates the animals. People make an effort to dress up and make it an important evening."

Ali Ramsay of Victoria, BC, had a phenomenal Royal, with the first clear round of the evening in the \$205,000 Longines FEI Jumping World Cup and a quick and fault-free jump-off trip to finish third aboard **Hermelien vd Hooghoeve**. "I think my horse did everything I asked of her," said Ramsay; the pair also placed 8th in the Big Ben Challenge on Thursday evening. Ramsay, 26, first attended the Royal Horse Show in 2012 when she won the Running Fox CET Medal Final.

Keean White was named Leading Canadian Rider, while his ride Leilani, an eightyear-old grey Oldenburg mare owned by Lisa Marie Gauthier and Angelstone Farm, earned the title of All Canadian Cup Leading Canadian-Owned Horse. Captain **Brian Cournane** (IRL) won the \$36,000 Brickenden Trophy International Jumpers riding **Penelope Cruz**, a 10-year-old Irish Sport Horse mare acquired from fellow Irishman Darragh Kerins a year ago. While Cournane is new to the Royal, he's very familiar with course designer Alan Wade. "It's very funny; when I was a kid doing hunter trials in Ireland, I was 16 or 17 and Alan was building the courses back then," said Cournane, 36. "Now we're at The Royal and he's building! It's incredible."

(Right) Jordan Macpherson, 29, of Toronto, ON, claimed the 1.40m Junior/Amateur Jumping Championship title aboard Fiestamunde, an eight-year-old Dutch Warmblood mare owned by Sved Stables. The pair steadily improved during the show, placing eighth in the opening welcome class, third in the speed class and winning the stake in the mare's first indoor event. "It's always great to win, but it's even better when you win at The Royal," said Macpherson, who trains with the Millar family. "My goal is to move her up and compete in the Canadian Show Jumping Championship next year. She's a pretty amazing horse and I'm really lucky to have her."

Julia Madigan, 22. of Vancouver, BC, claimed the Uplands Under 25 National Championship aboard Farfelu du Printemps, a 13-year-old Belgian Warmblood gelding owned by her father, John Madigan. The pair, who are coached by Jill Henselwood, also took the 1.40m Junior/ Amateur Jumping Championship in 2017. "I think the U25 is a bit more competitive and a bit bigger than the Junior/Amateur, so it's an extra boost for me," said Madigan, who is a full-time student in her final year of mechanical engineering at Queen's University in Kingston, ON.

Nicole Walker of Aurora. ON. was crowned the winner of the \$125,000 Canadian Show Jumping Championship after incurring just one rail and a single time fault over two days and three Alan Wadedesigned courses aboard Falco van Spieveld, her 13-year-old Belgian Warmblood gelding. "It was definitely a pressure situation. because there was really no room for error," said Walker, who was the U25 champion here in 2017. "This is a very humbling sport, so I never expected [to win], but we were hopeful and positive, and the horse has been feeling amazing all week, so I'm glad we could pull it off."



Kilby Brunner Deforest, 14, of Hillsburgh, ON, and Beaverwood's Halo jumped to victory in the \$5,000 MarBill Hill Farm Royal Pony Jumper Final to take the division championship. "This is my fifth time competing in the pony jumpers at The Royal," said Brunner Deforest, who was reserve champion in 2016 and 2017. "This is a new pony for me; she is very fast and really good in the turns," she said of the 14-year-old mare owned by her, mother, Kirsten Brunner. "She's very confident and handled the noise and the [Coca-Cola Coliseum] very well. I love coming here and competing over a few days in front of a big crowd."

It's very rare that you hop on something and sync together so quickly," said Kieffer. "The format is fun; it's energetic. If it gets one person to leave here and go Google 'eventing' and get into it, then it did its purpose."

Kendal Lehari of Uxbridge, ON - a familiar face in this event since its inception - rode her Thoroughbred gelding Totally Frank to third place.



With chrome, a commanding presence and correct conformation, Canadian Sport Horse **Karamel K** (Redwine x Primadonna K) brought **Ashland Farm** of Ashton, ON, its third Governor General's Cup win, following in the hoofsteps of Popeye K in 2000 and Roman K in 2005. The flashy chestnut filly's dam was Popeye K's first foal and has the topline and hip of her grandsire, and the head, neck and movement of her sire, Redwine, according to Paul Morgan, who operates Ashland Farm with Darlene Tierney, where Redwine stands. In the past, Morgan and Tierney left Cup handling duties to pro Ronnie Davidson; this year, Tierney took on the task. It was an up-and-down year at line shows as Tierney struggled with how to bring out the mare's best trot. She showed Karamel K to second place at Devon this year before handling the mare for her Cup win. "Naturally, Darlene was over the moon," says Morgan. Karamel K was also named CSH Senior Champion Filly. *~ Tracy Hanes*

After **Sullivan GS** was backed in July, 2018, owner/breeder **Alanna Parker** of Riguard, Quebec, suspected she had a Lieutenant Governor's Cup contender on her hands due to his exceptional movement and brain. Her hunch was confirmed by Sandra Laprise, owner of his sire, Sir Wanabi. With 18-year-old rider Teha Lapointe aboard, the 17.2 HH Canadian Sport Horse gelding, who hadn't attended any qualifiers, took top spot in the LG Cup at the Royal. Although confident the horse would finish in the top 10, the win was a complete surprise to Parker. "This was our first time competing in this class with a homebred, so it was very emotional hearing his name over the loudspeaker," she said.
