For 30 years, the core of our mission has been ensuring the quality care and treatment of horses through intervention, education, and outreach.

This month, as we continue to celebrate our 30th anniversary, we're delving into intervention and what this facet of our mission looks like at Days End Farm Horse Rescue (DEFHR).

### A Spotlight on: Intervention

All of the horses that come to DEFHR for rehabilitation come through animal protection agencies from across Maryland and surrounding states that have had to intervene in severe cases of abuse or neglect.

When a case has been identified as requiring intervention and seizure of a horse or horses, our DEFHR team goes with the animal protection officials to pick up the animals involved and transport them back to our farm in Woodbine, MD.

Once seized, the horses are considered live evidence in an active court case. As such, they are photographed upon arrival and a veterinarian is on hand to provide an evaluation and immediate care to start the rehabilitation – and often life-saving – process.

Here's a look at just two examples of DEFHR intervention success stories!



#### Quest

Animal control officers in Washington County, MD, were completing a routine welfare check when they came across an old stable where Quest and two other horses had been kept for, as they would come to find out, more than 10 years!

Quest's hooves had grown three feet in length, curling and spiraling out, making it nearly impossible for him to walk.

In the weeks and months that followed, we witnessed an incredible transformation both physically and mentally. A pony that had not been able to lay down in years was now rolling in the mud and calling out to other horses at the farm. Quest was learning to be a horse again!


He continued to surpass all odds when he was cleared for training by our veterinarian and farrier five months after arriving.



In order to increase the likelihood of a successful adoption, DEFHR often brings horses to local horse shows, fairs and festivals to further their training, at liberty work, and exposure to crowds.

Throughout his summer of appearances, Quest's remarkable character continued to shine through, inspiring all who met him.

We are so proud of Quest and so thankful for a chance to be a small part in his incredible journey!



#### Windsor

Around 5 p.m. on June 22, 2017 DEFHR received a call for help from Carroll County Animal Control. Within an hour our emergency response team was ready to deploy and help 18 horses in desperate need of care. While our emergency response team was en route, our barn staff, interns, and volunteers prepared our main barn for the horses' arrival, setting up a quarantine area and a first aid station and prepping each stall with fresh water, bedding, and hay. With 18 horses on their way, our entire main barn would be operating as a critical care facility for these horses.

Out of the 18, Windsor was one of the most emaciated. His body was completely depleted and malnourished.



After weeks of rehabilitation, he slowly started gaining weight, becoming stronger and stronger each day. We were so happy the day Windsor joined our main gelding herd and was cleared to start in training. Almost a year after he first arrived as an emaciated gelding, Windsor boarded the trailer ready for his next chapter and a new home with a young girl who is spoiling him rotten!

### Days End Receives Brennan Equine Welfare Fund Grant

The Brennan Equine Welfare Fund (BEWF) has announced Days End Farm Horse Rescue as one of 12 recipients of the organization's annual grants, thanks to our work with a horse named Dobbin's Dapper Drummer.

In 2018, "Dobbin" was seized along with four other horses in West Virginia after they were found neglected and malnourished. We transported these five horses to our facility in Maryland where they received immediate critical and rehabilitative care. During Dobbin's recovery it became clear that he was a calm, personable gelding that enjoyed being with people. He was evaluated and trained and was adopted in April to be a therapy horse for Trails of Purpose, a unique Certified Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International (PATH Intl.) Center that helps veterans overcome trauma through the partnership of horses and humans.

Grants from Brennan Equine Welfare Fund are used to serve equine rescue shelters across the country that provide dignity to final years of aged, injured, abused, starved and slaughter-bound horses, as well as those used in medical experimentation.
