Staying Positive in Uncertain Times

What a difference a month can make. Lately, it seems as if the news of COVID-19's global impact changes day by day, even hour by hour. As the world navigates through challenging times, we remain positive for the future. Days End Farm Horse Rescue has weathered tough situations over the past 31 years, but because of the strength and resiliency from everyone connected with our facility, we are able to stay focused on our mission—making a difference in the lives of abused and neglected horses.

Because of you, we have been able to make calm, thoughtful decisions to practice the same level of excellence you have come to expect. As you make decisions regarding your charitable giving, we hope that you will continue to choose DEFHR. We cannot carry on our mission without your loyalty and support, but together with your help, we can continue to make an impact.

Here at DEFHR, we have followed the State of Maryland's guidelines regarding onsite personnel and have taken proactive steps to protect the health of our staff, volunteers, and supporters, while still focusing on the quality of care and commitment to our horses that we're known for. Here are some of the policies we've put in place during this time:

- For now, the farm is closed off to the public and the office personnel are currently working from home.
- Our closure includes the cancellation of orientations, used tack shop sales, adoption appointments and other scheduled on-site appointments, volunteer groups, field trips and other onsite-educational programming as well as tours and agri-tourism walk-ins.
- For the first time in our history, we have suspended all volunteers from physically volunteering on the property in accordance with the state of Maryland's Stay-At-Home Order. Staff that are not directly involved with animal care and some volunteers are working remotely, leveraging creative and innovative ways to keep our organization running and our supporters engaged.
