Taylor Land and Get Go Are Victorious in \$50,000 WEC Fall Grand Prix Finale

The fifth and final week of the World Equestrian Center (WEC) Fall Show Series in Wilmington, Ohio, had a full schedule of exciting events, including the \$50,000 WEC Fall Grand Prix Finale. Taylor Land (USA) of Alpharetta, Georgia, was victorious in the class over five others in the jump-off riding Get Go, her nine-year-old Hanoverian gelding by Grey Top x Wantana.

"I took advantage of my horse's large stride, so I was able to leave out strides in a few spots to save time," said Land of her jump-off plan. "I thought that the jump off was so fun! 'Grumbles' handled it so well. My strategy was to go smooth and forward and to put some pressure on the people behind me."

The plan worked as Land crossed the finish timers in 37.862 seconds for the win. Second place went to Nichole Loochtan and Caiman des Sequoias, who had a time of 39.097 seconds. Kady Abrahamson and Vancouver were third in 39.195 seconds.

Havens Schatt and Cascartini Prove Unbeatable in \$30,000 WEC Hunter Derby 3'6"-3'9"

Havens Schatt of Lexington, Ky., took home another major win from the WEC Fall Show Series after she and Cascartini, a nine-year-old Holsteiner gelding by Casall Ask owned by Ken and Amy Wexler LLC, won the \$30,000 WEC Hunter Derby 3'6"-3'9". Schatt and Cascartini, who also won \$30,000 derby during week 3, led from the start with a score of 181. They were brilliant in the second, handy round with a score of 202 for a total of 383 for the win.

"I have been focusing much of my time on Havana, the horse that I showed in the 3' Open Derby because she is more green," mentioned Schatt. "Marty (Cascartini) is seasoned and has won a lot, so I have given him more time off. Those in the stands may not have been able to tell, but in round one he felt pretty frisky and fresh underneath me. After that round, we galloped a few laps and decided to re-group ourselves for the handy. He was his normal self in round two and was just amazing!"

Melissa Donnelly and Corlando 49 finished second with a total score of 374, while Tiffany Lee rode Favoriet to third place with a score of 336.
