

“He is fresh from Europe. This is his first show in America. He was a jumper in Europe, and he is now fantastic as a hunter!”




Richard Rinehart earned his first major win of the week in the \$10,000 WEC Futures Prix at WEC – Wilmington aboard his own Captain America.








Sunday Spotlights: Rio the Brazilian Warmblood and Will Baker


