How long have you been riding, and how did you get involved with horses? I started riding when I was five years old, so 16 years now. My family has a long lineage of horsemanship dating back to my great-great-grandfather teaching the troops how to ride in World War I. My mother taught me to ride on my first pony, Blaze, and I have loved it ever since.

What is your favorite part about being a working student at IFS?

My favorite part has been watching so many amazing riders achieve their goals with their horses. In addition, I love working with the incredible horses at the farm. From everyday chores to riding, they are just amazing athletes, have the kindest hearts, and have the best personalities.

What is one of the most important things you have learned while working with IFS?

I have had the great opportunity to ride many amazing horses at IFS. In addition to understanding their differences and similarities, the most important thing I learned from Ilan Ferder was to really listen to what your horse is telling you about themselves, what they want to do, and what they need you to do to make them their best. This is a skill that goes a long way for riders at the top level of the sport, like Erynn Ballard, who I hope to ride at the same level with someday.

What is your favorite horse show and why?

Since I am Canadian, I would have to say that my favorite horse show is the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto. We don't have many indoor horse shows, but this one is so special to a lot of Canadians. It was where I had my first opportunity to watch international show jumping in person. The atmosphere is incredible for show jumping, and I'm excited that it will be back this year for its 100th anniversary!

Who is your favorite horse and why?

I couldn't possibly pick just one. My favorite horses at IFS would have to be Diableur, who has the most personality; Comedie de Talma, who is always whinnying in the barn and loves cuddles; and Latina 262, Cameron Fraatz's barn princess. They are truly all amazing! I would be remiss if I didn't mention my own County 7 and Celino. I truly believe you have to love the horse before the sport, and these two horses have taught me so much in and out of the competition ring. It really is an incredible thing to have such partnerships with these amazing creatures, and I am so grateful for them.
