





World Equestrian Center Highlights From Ocala Winter Spectacular VIII and Wilmington Winter in the Midwest XI



Santiago Lambre (BRA) and his own Chacco Blue II secured victory in the \$100,000 Hampton Green Farms Grand Prix at WEC – Ocala.

"It wasn't the plan to show this week. He had two weeks off after the five-star, and he is going to show here at World Equestrian Center – Ocala next week in the three-star. He needed to jump a bit, and it was either going to be at home or here. I decided to enter him in the class two days ago. I am happy with the outcome, and I am looking forward to next week's CSI3*."

Sam Pegg (CAN) and Gin Tonic 158, owned by Ten Sixty Stables, topped the podium in the \$30,000 Tribute Equine Nutrition Grand Prix at WEC – Wilmington.

"[Gin Tonic 158] knows his job once you get going. He has a lot of blood. I tried to get away from the second jump and turn quickly back to the vertical. I took a little bit of time to jump the combination because with an oxer to a vertical you jump a little high on the way in. He jumped it nicely, and I did one less stride to the last fence."

"The course was beautiful today. The jumps were big, and I really enjoyed how they used the end of the ring to connect the track. You felt like you were riding jump to jump rather than taking a stroll in the turns."



"I try and go for it since [Copa Du Cache] is so good. I always think about the next time and try to get better. It was a fun course tonight with a lot of options."




Sam Pegg (CAN) and Claas, owned by Ten Sixty Stables, won the \$10,000 Futures Prix at WEC – Wilmington.








Sunday Spotlight: Jadina and Addison Reed
