## SHOW TIME 2023 ROYAL HORSE SHOW—Toronto, Canada

The CSI4\*-W Royal Horse Show, held as part of the 101st Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto, Canada, from November 3–12, 2023, entered its second century of excellence in style. Top international athletes went head-to-head in front of a packed house in the Coca-Cola Coliseum in a world-class show jumping competition. **Daniel Bluman**, of Israel, reigned supreme riding **Gemma W** in the marquee event, the \$250,000 Longines FEI Jumping World Cup<sup>TM</sup> Toronto. **Jessica Mendoza**, of Great Britain, finished second with **I-Cap CL Z**, while U.S. Olympian **Kent Farrington** closed out his banner week with a third-place finish riding **Greya**. The show's action-packed schedule was also highlighted by classes ranging from hunters and equitation to indoor eventing and heavy horses, leaving no shortage of excitement throughout the event's 11-day run.
