In the \$150,000 <u>Lugano Diamonds</u> Grand Prix CSI3* at WEC – Ocala, Olympian Beat Mändli (SUI) dazzled the crowd with Amiro B Z.

"This is actually our first grand prix jumpoff. I came here to get him ready for the winter circuit ahead, and I did not expect to win. He felt amazing tonight and handled the crowd very well. I was surprised to see so many people; it was nice to ride and a really fun evening. I have really high hopes for him in the future."
