Thirty-one elite combinations from 11 different nations showcased their talents in the \$75,000 <u>Coca-Cola</u> <u>Beverages Florida</u> Grand Prix. In an exciting eight-horse jump-off, Peter Petschenig (AUT) claimed victory aboard Ennebel Van Het Posthuijs owned by Petschenig Showjumping, LLC.

"I always ride the course the way she feels going in, if that makes any sense. If she attacks the first jump, I just keep going. She just runs and goes. I don't think you could wish for a better partner than 'Ennebel.' I think she knows me inside out, and I know her inside out. She's uncomplicated and jumps one and a half classes a week. She's as easy as you can get and jumps her heart out each time she steps in the ring."

"I wanted to just make good jumps because there weren't really a whole lot of places to be really handy. So, it was a bit more of a jumping competition. I didn't want to rush my way around; I wanted to let him finish his jump and be as smooth as possible."

"I started him about a year and a half ago beginning in the 1.20m and working up from there. We got him from Elysian Stables in Miami, and they had a lot of junior and amateur jumpers. He didn't fit into that model, so we did some horse trading, which worked out for everyone. He has all the heart in the world, which I think is the most important thing to have in this sport."

Tracy Fenney claimed victory, achieving her second one-two finish of the 2024 Summer Series aboard MTM Holding Court and MTM Knock Out, both owned by MTM Farm, in the \$10,000 <u>UF Veterinary Hospital</u> USHJA National 3' Open Hunter Derby.

"It was so great that they put the classes out here in the WEC Stadium. It's great for the horses to get them out in this environment, and it was good practice for us riders."

In the \$10,000 USHJA National 3' Jr/Am Hunter Derby, Hayley Waters Wear and Mr. and Mrs. Chuck Waters' Genuine were superior with a nearperfect handy score. A textbook round from start to finish earned the pair an astonishing score of 99 in the handy – the highest score of the circuit – for an overall total of 194, which secured their victory.

"He's such a great horse. I was so excited to get a 99. He actually got a 98 a few weeks ago at WEC, but 99 is his highest yet. He will get a muchdeserved break after the circuit; he's been incredible."
