Canada's Sam Pegg and his quickest mount, Gin Tonic 158, proved their dominance against the field with yet another grand prix win in the \$50,000 Grand Prix of WEC – Wilmington Fall Classic II.

"I decided to stay on nine strides from one to two in the jump-off. I tried to focus on the turns and get away from the back side of the jumps. There were two right hand turns, and that's his favorite way. I thought I didn't have to try to perform a miracle but make tight turns and keep his feet moving."

The \$10,000 <u>Clinton County CVB</u> Futures Prix was the first featured class of the afternoon at WEC – Wilmington Fall Classic II. Annalice Weithofer (USA) and her seasoned mount, Trig Happy Wind Van Het Eikenhof, ultimately were the

only duo to conquer Robert Barton's tracks and move onto the jump-off phase.

"I have had him for the past three years now. When I first got him, I started in the 1.15m. He has helped me grow as a rider and has really shown me the ropes in the bigger classes. I have jumped a few small grands prix on him. He is 17 now, so we pick and choose what classes he will show in. He is just keeping me going, and I am enjoying still being able to show him!"
