n a landmark result, the U.S. Paralympic dressage team stamped their place in the history books by earning the gold medal at the conclusion of team competition at the 2024 Paralympic Games in Paris, France. This marked the first-ever team gold for the U.S. Para Dressage Team at a Paralympic Games and the second consecutive Paralympic team medal following its team bronze at the 2020 Paralympic Games in Tokyo, Japan.

The three team athletes laid down impressive scores to top the silver-medal-winning team from The Netherlands. Roxanne Trunnell and Karin Flint's Fan Tastico H scored a 77.000%, Fiona Howard and Diamond Dunes owned by Dressage Family LLC and Hof Kasselmann scored a stellar personal best of 80.000%, and Rebecca Hart with Rowan O'Riley's Floratina scored a 78.567% for a cumulative score of 235.567% — the highest Paralympic team score ever recorded.

Rebecca Hart and Floratina (Grade III), Fiona Howard and Diamond Dunes (Grade II), and Roxanne Trunnell and Fan Tastico H (Grade I) each produced top performances scoring 77% or higher in the FEI Grand Prix Test B.
