


A Christmas Surprise Pony From DEFHR Becomes a Champion and a Friend to Three Young Girls



For Christmas in 2018, three young girls were gifted a small chestnut pony wrapped in a bow. Joker's Jester was a surprise present for Peyton, Jordyn, and Presley Sears. Although he was smaller than what their mother, Jamie Sears, was ideally looking for, one touching moment sealed the deal for the family. In the intervening years, the little pony with the big heart has been a constant companion for the girls, taking them on trail rides, to competitions, and on countless adventures.

Joker's Jester arrived at Days End Farm Horse Rescue (DEFHR) in Woodbine, MD, in August 2018. He was a transfer from the SPCA of Texas, which had just started an open admission program and was overwhelmed with horses, so DEFHR was happy to collaborate with the peer organization and take the little gelding in. He was in a healthy condition, and although he was unbacked, his fantastic temperament and easy-going personality made getting him started a breeze.

The girls' mother, Jamie Sears, adopted Joker's Jester on December 22, 2018, but she and her husband kept it a secret from their daughters. On Christmas morning, the girls arrived at the barn to see a cute little chestnut pony waiting for them in the aisle. They all hugged Jester while the good-natured gelding stood calmly.

"The time, effort, and the experiences the team gives their horses at Days End Farm is amazing," she explained. "Leigha took him foxhunting, cross-country, and to a parade — most horses don't do that in their lifetime, let alone at a rescue. They expose their horses to a lot during their process, and that's why Jester is game for everything."

Zillow Shows What's Possible



In October, DEFHR's rescue pony Zillow performed in demos in front of hundreds of people at both the Capital Challenge Horse Show and the Washington International Horse Show (pictured). He is the embodiment of what is possible with care, love and the attention these neglected horses deserve.

"When I first started working with Zillow, I didn't know how much I'd be able to help him, said Days End Farm Horse Rescue Assistant Trainer Leigha Schrader. "He'd been through a great amount of trauma and being locked in a small, dark space it had done a great deal of psychological damage."

Zillow was understandably mistrustful of people, and had a tendency to bolt in-hand, sometimes even jumping fences in panic.

"It took months, but Zillow slowly started to trust and relax in our training sessions. He learned to trust me to keep him safe. With time he was eager to be with me more and he wanted to please me. Before I knew it, he was my new liberty partner. He was picking up something new each week," continued Schrader. "He's an amazing example of what can be accomplished with patience and good care. It's not every day that you meet a horse like Zillow."

"Corn Chip the Clever Donkey: From **Obese and Unhandled to Trim and** Friendly"

When a minimally handled obese donkey with severely overgrown feet came to DEFHR in July 2024, his complex case required careful management. Corn Chip had been living on a large estate in Western Maryland sharing hundreds of acres with another donkey and a herd of cattle.

When he arrived at DEFHR, he was estimated to be around 16 years old and was fearful of people.

"Every rehab journey is unique, shaped by the circumstances and personalities of each equine. Corn Chip, having lived a life free of human interaction and handling, arrived shy and fearful of humans," said DeEtte Hillman, DEFHR Equine Programs Director. "While Corn Chip has made significant progress, he is still classified as being in rehabilitation due to the ongoing, meticulous hoof care he requires."

16hh 13-year-old Thoroughbred mare

Offelia is a 13-year-old 16hh off-the-track Thoroughbred (OTTB) mare with so much to give. Under her registered name, Fairbanks Kiss, she raced 53 times and then became a broodmare. She had no prior retraining before being taken in by DEFHR, but is currently walking and trotting quietly under saddle in the arena and going out for short hacks alone. She is suitable for light arena work and trail riding.

Offelia is a sweet mare, is not spooky, and is light in the mouth. An adopter with previous experience with OTTBs and a slow approach to training would be the best fit for this lovely mare. Giving Gratitude


