



Vince and Kadara Top a Blistering Jump-Off Field

Upper Marlboro, MD – Jumpers joined the show on Thursday, October 2, at the 2025 Capital Challenge Horse Show at The Show Place Arena for the North American League (NAL) Finals at the 1.15m height for juniors and amateurs. Earlier in the day, the Amateur-Owner Hunters determined their champions, while the Adult Hunters ran three divisions in the outdoor arena to determine a grand champion.

In the \$10,000 NAL 1.15m Amateur Jumper Final presented by SmartEquine, the top four finishers in the jump-off were within one second of each other. However, it was Willow Vince of Verbank, NY, and Kadara, owned by Summer Stone Farm, who were able to trip the timers with the fastest time of 34.164 seconds over seven other competitors in the second round. Second place went to Taylor Kungle on Breakwater Farm LLC's Quickly Stated, who finished in 34.385 seconds. With a time of 34.955 seconds, Rachel Boggus and Conrad 149, owned by 18 Gauge LLC, placed third.

"She has two speeds — fast and faster — so in the first round, we always try to kind of go slow and then we can really gallop in the jump off. In the jump-off, sometimes I get a little too casual to jump one or I go a little too fast, so I wanted to meet jump one very nicely," said Vince of her riding plan. "I know my horse is so quick, and I just used her specialty of going fast. I just kept putting my foot on the gas."

Vince described the 10-year-old KWPN mare by Dakar VDL as a "typical mare." She continued, "She's a little opinionated in the barn, but will do absolutely everything for me, and I just couldn't thank her enough."



Babun and Her Soulmate Notch "Amazing" Win

In the \$10,000 North American League (NAL) 1.15m Junior Jumper Final, it was a race to the very last of 15 rides in the jump-off. Turning in the final performance were Katherine Babun and Amazing Z, who were able to top everyone with a second clear round in a time of 33.116 seconds. Second place went to Georgina Jewell on her own Conny 424, who were clear in 34.497 seconds. With a time of 34.623 seconds, Emi Richard rode Canturino for Oceans Edge Farm to third place.

Heading into the arena, Babun knew she had to give a strong ride after yesterday's welcome when she "didn't have the best round." Despite some nerves, Babun accomplished her goal with Amazing Z, who was in her first competition in an indoor arena.

"My plan for the jump-off was just to go fast and not to second guess myself because she's so game and I trust her," she said of her second ride. "Since everybody was having such fast times, it was just not slow down and ride off my gallop. She's better that way, and I think that everything just came off the gap, and I think it worked out."



Martha Ingram Sweeps Grand Championships

While Martha Ingram is no stranger to winning grand hunter championships at Capital Challenge, she had not captured one with her longtime partner Private Practice. The pair won all three over fences classes to win the Amateur-Owner 3'3" 18-35 Hunter division, sponsored by Pine Hollow Farm, which also named them Grand Amateur-Owner 3'3" Hunter Champions, which is sponsored by Woodhill Farm. The pair was presented with the Missy McCutcheon Memorial Trophy donated by Susie Baker, Dr. Michele Hollis, and John Yozell, and Ingram won the Best Amateur-Owner 3'3" Rider Award, sponsored by Spring Mill Farm.

"He's always been amazing, but with age he's gotten easier and easier and easier," said Ingram of the 15-year-old Holsteiner gelding by Lordanos. "He's such a pro that we really don't do too much, and he just comes out and he's a winner, day in and day out. I've had him about five years now, and he feels better now than he did even five years ago. I'm really thankful to our team for keeping him so happy and healthy."

Moving from one division to the next, Ingram kept on winning, this time with Jenkins in the Amateur-Owner 3'6" 18-35 Hunters where they picked up first, second, and sixth places for the division championship, sponsored by The Hallman Family and MerryLegs South LLC. These ribbons also secured them the Grand Amateur-Owner 3'6" Championship, sponsored by Finally Farm, and they received the Dr. Harold M.S. Smith Trophy donated by Dr. Suzanne Smith and Dr. Peter Craig. Ingram was presented with the Best Amateur-Owner 3'6" Rider Award sponsored by Mr. and Mrs. Ernest M. Oare and awarded The So Many Challenge Trophy donated by Karen Kramer.

"He is a kinder, honest animal," described Ingram of the nine-year-old KWPN gelding by Charisma. "We got him from Nick Haness a few years ago, and I can't say enough about how adorable and sweet this animal is. His name is 'Baby J' in the barn."

With his 16.2-hand height and big body, Ingram has learned to manage him through a course of jumps and noted that his rideability has improved through the years.


