In its inaugural year, the USET Foundation Performance Pathway Jumping Grant awarded \$75,000 in direct athlete grants, which helped Skylar Wireman and Mia Bagnato travel to and compete at the FEI Jumping Nations Cup™ Youth Final in Lier, Belgium, where the U.S. Young Rider team attained gold, and helped carry youth riders to the North American Youth Jumping Championships (NAYC), including triple gold medalist Khloe Kerins.



More broadly, 2025 was a year of growth and optimism for U.S. equestrian sport. Among the numerous achievements, U.S. equestrian athletes participated in 31 FEI Nations Cup competitions and earned 18 podium finishes across the seven international disciplines.
